Herzlich Willkommen in Ludwigsburg!

The Protestant University of Applied Sciences in Ludwigsburg offers students from our partner universities the opportunity to study with us for one semester. We offer degree programmes in Social Work, Early Childhood Education, Deaconry, Religious Education, Nursing and Care, and Inclusive Pedagogy and Special Needs Education in German. In addition, we offer a range of courses in English, mainly in our International Social Work Bachelor program.

Project studies (12 ECTS)

In this module students work in a social field/organisation and carry out a self-planned project. They get to know project work and learn to develop, implement and reflect a self-implemented project.

International, intercultural and interreligious perspectives (6 ECTS)

In this module students collect knowledge and learn to position themselves with regards to the history and present situation of Germany as a migration society. They learn skills and develop the ability to reflect their own role against the background of an intercultural and diversity-oriented society.

Health promotion in international comparison (6 ECTS)

In this module students learn about health and health promotion as a field of social work. They get theoretical and practical input

which will help them to understand how health and other personal and social conditions are connected and how health promotion can be implemented.

Gender perspectives (6 ECTS)

In this module students deal with current issues and challenges of gender research in the context of education, employment, poverty, migration, violence, social changes of family and care work. They learn about construction and deconstruction of gender in everyday life, in families, in various fields of social work, as well as in national and international organisations and institutions.

Inclusion and exclusion from an international perspective (6 ECTS)

This module covers international inclusion / exclusion discourse, theories and legal bases of inclusion. Students learn to understand inclusion and exclusion as the basis of social order and human coexistence and are capable to create and reflect inclusive situations in social work and to realise inclusive educational approaches.

Welfare state and social policy (6 ECTS)

Students engage with a general framework of social work against the background of globalisation, economisation, Europeanisation as well as social and welfare state transformation processes. They get to know conditions of formation and contextual relationships of social problems as well as solution approaches from a macroeconomic point of view.

Support for life management: counselling, community service and pastoral care in an international perspective (6 ECTS)

Students acquire knowledge and skills of systemic conversation, different methodological approaches for contextual needs. They develop in-depth competence in systemic conversation management and their own professionally justified and reflected attitude in conversation with clients.

Changes and cancellations of individual courses are possible. You also have the opportunity to take part in international lectures and workshops, excursions and other programmes for students.
